Are there things we need to say sorry for? Will God forgive us?  What's the problem in this story? Are God's people trusting Him?  Do we sometimes forget to trust in God?

Jonathan and David would remain good friends. Why was Saul jealous of David? Saul continues to make more terrible decisions. Now his jealousy is leading him to want to murder David. Does our sin usually get better or worse?

(See Ephesians 5:1-2) If you could ask God for anything in the whole world, what would you ask Him for? What did Solomon ask God for? Solomon begins to build the temple. What are some details that stood out to you about this temple? Where is God's temple today? (See 1 Corinthians 3:16-17) How long did it take to build the temple? What details stood out in today's reading? Why was the temple important?

2 Kings 19:1-19	Israel had been taken captive by Assyria, but now Judah was under attack. Why do you think Hezekiah turned to God for help?  Can we turn to God for help when we face struggles?
2 Kings 25:1-17	Now Babylon destroyed Jerusalem and even the temple! Why would God allow this to happen maybe? Does God sometimes let bad things happen?
Job 1:1-22	What terrible things happened to Job. Did these things happen because Job did something wrong? But if not, why might God be allowing these
Job 2:1-13	things? What did Satan do to Job in this part? Was God still in control of the whole situation? How do we know that? Even with all this bad, did Job trust in God?

At the end when it says "redeem Israel"is this talking about us too? (See Galatians 3:27-29) Who does David direct his crying and pleading to? Who can we direct our prayers and seeking to? (See Matthew 6:33) Who wrote this psalm? How does David feel about his sin? What are some reasons David wants to be forgiven? If we ask God forgiveness, will He forgive us? Who wrote this psalm? What do you think this person might be struggling with? What aspects of God do they hold onto? When the psalmist thinks back to God's past activity, what are some things he remembers about God? What can we remember about what God has done?
Week 27 Psalm 88:1-18  Psalm 90:1-17  Psalm 91:1-16  Psalm 95:1-96:13 Psalm 99:1-100:5	This is probably one of the darkest psalms in the book, ending on a dark note. Do you sometimes feel like God has forgotten you? Will God ever leave you? (See Matthew 28:20) Who is the only person God has ever fully left? Why do you think? (See Mark 15:34) Who wrote this psalm? Why do you think Moses focused on what he did in this psalm? Do you remember some of these things from our readings from Exodus? What is God described as in this psalm? Who is your fortress and refuge? What stands out to you in these Psalms? Can you relate? What do you think holy means? If God is our shepherd, what does that make us kind of like? Do sheep really need shepherd, or can they do life on their own?
Week 28 Psalm 111:1-10 Psalm 117:1-118:29 Psalm149:1-150:6 Proverbs 3:1-35	What is the beginning of wisdom? What do you think fearing the Lord means? What are some of God's great works? Psalm 117 is the shortest chapter in the bible! Psalm 118:8 is often said to be the very center verse of the Bible! What stood out to you in these psalms? (See Psalm 119 for longest chapter in the Bible):) What stands out to you in how the book of Psalms ends? Will the end of our life end with praise do you think? Why? (See Revelation 21:1-8) Who wrote much of Proverbs? (See Proverbs 1:1 and chapter introduction) What stood out to you in this reading?

Proverbs 18:1-24 What proverbs especially stood out tonight? What do you think it means that the tongue is so powerful? Week 29 Proverbs 19:1-29 What seems to be something wise in these proverbs? Where do we turn for help with these, and for forgiveness when we fall short of these proverbs? Did Jesus die to forgive you? Proverbs 31:1-31 What things stood out to you about a woman who fears the Lord? Nothing is better than to be a son or daughter of King Jesus! How are we brought into this family? (Romans 5:1-2) Notice in verse 1 when this vision took place? (See 2 Kings 19) Isaiah 1:1-20 What are some things God said to His people through the prophet Isaiah in this chapter? Isaiah 6:1-13 Wow! What are some things we see in this vision? What are some things we get to hear? Is this God our same God? Who is this prophecy about? (See Luke 2:7 and 11) Why is it amazing Isaiah 9:1-7 that the God we see in chapter 6 is the same God who comes to save us by dying on a cross? Week 30 Isaiah 11:1-10 Jesse was King David's dad. Why is it significant that this future savior would come from the line of Jesse? Who is this savior for all people? (See Matthew 1:1, 1:6, 1:16) Isaiah 25:1-12 What are some things that are said in this prophesy? One day will we live in heaven where there will be no more death? How is death defeated? (See 1 Corinthians 15:54-56) What does this say about God's Word? What is promised to those who Isaiah 40:1-31 wait on God? Isaiah 42:1-9 This prophecy is pointing forward to Jesus. (See Matthew 4:16) What do you think is meant by opening the eyes of the blind? Physically open, spiritually open, or both? What is said about idols in this section? Do we struggle with idols today? Isaiah 44:1-20 Could an idol ultimately be anything that we make more important than God? Week 31 Isaiah 55:1-13 What stands out to you in this chapter? What is God trying to say do you think? Isaiah 61:1-11 (See Luke 4:17-21) Jesus himself would fulfill this prophesy hundreds of years later. What are some things we learn from this text that Jesus will do?
